

Philip A. Odeen

Philip A. Odeen is Executive Vice President of TRW's Washington, DC-focused operations. He is TRW's senior representative in Washington and is responsible for select business development and international activities of TRW's Aerospace and Information sector. He is also a member of the TRW Management Committee.

Previously, Mr. Odeen was responsible for TRW's \$3 billion Systems & Information Technology business, which offers value-added solutions through information technology systems and services; systems engineering and analysis; systems development and integration; and enterprise management services.

Mr. Odeen was President and Chief Executive Officer of BDM, which TRW acquired in 1997, and directed its growth and evolution as a multi-national information technology (IT) firm. Under his leadership, BDM grew from under \$300 million in revenue to the billion-dollar mark in five years.

Before joining BDM as president in 1992, Mr. Odeen was Vice Chairman, Management Consulting Services, at Coopers & Lybrand, where he directed a consulting practice of 2,500 in 30 cities. Earlier, he served 13 years as managing partner of the firm's public sector practice. From 1973 to 1978, he was Vice President of the Wilson Sporting Goods Company.

Mr. Odeen has served in senior positions with the Office of the Secretary of Defense and the National Security Council (NSC) staff. He was Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense (Systems Analysis) and later led the Defense and Arms Control staff for the NSC.

Mr. Odeen is active in various government advisory groups, primarily in the defense and national security area. In 1997 Secretary of Defense William Cohen selected him to chair the National Defense Panel (NDP), and he currently is Vice Chairman of the Defense Science Board and a member of the Chief of Naval Operations Executive Panel. He also has chaired various Defense Science Board Task Forces on logistics and outsourcing.

Mr. Odeen is a director of Convergys Corp. and active in business and community activities. He chairs the Virginia Business Council and the Henry Jackson Foundation, which supports defense-related medical research, including research by the DoD Uniformed Services Medical University. He has served on the boards of community organizations, including the Northern Virginia Technology Council, the Wolf Trap Foundation, Inova Health Care, and Childhelp USA. He was chairman of the Professional Services Council, the Government Affairs Committee of the Association of Management Consulting Firms, and the World Affairs Council of Washington.

A native of South Dakota, Mr. Odeen graduated Phi Beta Kappa with a B.A. in government from the University of South Dakota in 1957. He was a Fulbright Scholar to the United Kingdom a year later and earned a master's degree in 1959 from the University of Wisconsin.
